

This week, the Supreme Court announced that it will review whether several key components of President Obama's health care law are constitutional. For example, the Court will determine whether the federal government overstepped its constitutional powers by requiring every American to buy government-approved health insurance. I believe this provision is clearly unconstitutional, and several federal judges have reached the same conclusion. Restoring limits to the size and scope of government will help to safeguard our cherished freedoms, and I look forward to the Supreme Court hearing oral arguments next spring and issuing a definitive ruling on the law shortly thereafter. Regardless of what the high court decides, I believe Congress should [repeal this law in its entirety](#) because it fails to reduce health costs, jeopardizes the health coverage that millions of Americans currently have, and imposes severe hardships on job creators. Indeed, with over 14 million Americans already out of work, I believe repealing and replacing ObamaCare is essential to creating a more favorable environment for our nation's job-creating innovators and small businesses.
